1999 BC WITCHCAMP TEACHERS SELECTED

A Selection Committee consisting of Pat, Sage, Ruby, Cerridwen and Wilow -- as long distant consultant -- met in early November to select the teaching team for the 1999 BC Witchcamp, not an easy task to do considering the long list of skilled applicants to choose from. In most cases the applicants are experienced Reclaiming witchcamp teachers or aspiring student teachers. The latter, in some cases, are already teachers in their home communities and/or have assisted teachers at camp.

The selection was done in consultation with the Reclaiming Guidance Council who approached their work with integrity, experience and fairness. Thank you to Starhawk, Wilow Fire (Spokane), Raven (Vermont) and Oriana (Tofino) for their hard work. This is the first time in our history together

as camp communities that we have used this system and undoubtedly there will be discussions on how it worked in the months to come. The great part of working together is to sense the network which has been created between and among camps, as reflected in the diversity of our respective teachers — communities within the larger Reclaiming community.

We are pleased to announce our teaching team for 1999; they are: Sharon Jackson/Duncan BC (resource teacher), Ruby/Courtenay BC, Rosemary/Seattle WA, Inanna/Portland OR, Bridgid/Vancouver, Oak/San Francisco, Anne Hill/California, Student Teachers: Maecan/Vancouver, Puck/Virginia, Sara Morningstar/Vermont. Some of the considerations used for selection were: continuity (from last year), diversity of skills, energy, backgrounds, new people, a fair representation from our home community (BCWC) and representation from other camps.



gift! Thanks also to Susanne Schibler, Rebecca Games and Lynn Hudson for gifts.



Camp themes become hot topics of conversation on email. One theme that is recurring is Y2K. What does it mean to us, if anything? There's a range of opinions out there butit's safe to say that it conjures up talk of Sustainability and Conscious Living which many people feel is important in our work as witches and should be a focus at camp. Ecstatic, mysterious, awesome experiences while in trance, on visits to Feri, can be, and often is, part of the camp experience, but let's not forget the blending of spiritual and political work which is the basis of the Reclaiming Tradition. Starhawk put this in perspective at a recent workshop in Vancouver entitled "Lessons Learned from the Forest: Grounding Spirit in the Earth". She talked about making doubly or triply (?) sure that while on these inner journeys to check the voices we think we hear are not just some part of ourselves that is screaming out to be heard (words to that effect). This is not to discredit these experiences, but to put them into the broader pictures of Witchcraft as we practice it. How will this help me, help my community, the world?

Land purchase was discussed again at camp this year and a land committee formed. The following points have been raised at camp and by the committee:

- concerns about land ownership and the energy required
- necessity for planning for future generations
- possibility of not always being able to rent Loon Lake and the rising cost
- organization and administration required to provide continuity and longevity
- operational costs
- how and who to use the land
- fundraising: special events- write to UBC to let them know if they were ever to sell, we are interested (shoot for the moon!).
- use of someone's land
- -generous donor

We currently have nearly \$2500 in the land fund. \$200 of this amount was recently donated by the Victoria Spiral Dance Committee. Thank you Victoria witches!
