Join us for four days of magic, community, great food, and being on the land at Unicamp with Wild Ginger, a community of witches in the Reclaiming Tradition.

Rooted in our connection to the elements, we look to our relationships with trees as teachers; teachers of magic, of mystery, of science, and of alchemy. We take this journey in order to learn our piece of the work that is needed in our shared world.

This year's Wild Ginger theme is the "Sacred World Tree". Questioning ourselves, we approach the mysteries: What seeds do we plant? Where are our roots? How do we grow and spread our branches? What is our journey through the seasons of death and rebirth? And the answers slowly emerge through four camp rituals (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings and Sunday morning) and Path work, which will lead us as the way unfolds.

There will be free time for dancing, drumming, swimming, sunning, taking a nap, and optional offerings. Bring along anything you'd like to teach or share. Wild Gingers are always up for something new. Remember to bring things for the raffle! (OOOOOH, AAAAAH! Fabulous prizes!).

Wild Ginger encourages active participation in all rituals. It takes all the campers to raise the energy that makes the celebration called ritual work. For those who would like to do a little more, watch for the pre-camp call for ritual crafters. Those planning path and ritual are also open to your contributions!

Childcare will be available at camp for ritual and path work times. At least one path will also be appropriate for children's participation. You are ultimately responsible for your child at all times.

There is a vendors' space for those who would like to sell their wares. Vendors are asked to donate 10% of their earnings to the scholarship fund.

Camp fees are on a sliding scale, with adult fees from \$200-\$250. Children are \$100. Please send a minimum of \$50.00 deposit per person with your application, with the remainder postdated to June 1st. There are scholarships and work exchanges available.

Wild Ginger is drug and alcohol free.
